Griffins vs. Wolves

Fifth of eight meetings overall, second of four at Allstate Arena...Grand Rapids has come out on top in four straight regular season matchups between the teams at Allstate Arena...The Griffins won 5-2 on Dec. 2 at Chicago behind goals from five different scorers...The Wolves have won five straight overall games, including a 6-3 victory at Van Andel Arena last Friday...**Matt Lorito** (4-1—5) and **Matt Puempel** (1-4—5) tie for the team lead in scoring against Chicago this season, although both missed last Friday's meeting due to injury...Lorito banked his first pro hat trick in the season's first matchup on Oct. 27...Kasimir Kaskisuo recorded 33 saves and the Wolves shut out the Griffins on Nov. 3 in West Michigan, snapping Grand Rapids' four-game winning streak against Chicago on home ice...**Jared Coreau** has started all four games against Chicago this season, showing a 3.03 GAA and a 0.902 save percentage.

Fooled You Once, Fooled You Twice...

Today's game at Chicago marks the third straight season the Wolves have hosted the Griffins for a matinee affair. In the two previous renditions at Allstate Arena, Grand Rapids has outscored Chicago 12-1, including a 7-1 victory on Dec. 15, 2016 and a 5-0 triumph on Feb. 23, 2016.

Taming the Wolves

Under third-year head coach **Todd Nelson**, the Griffins are 16-5-1-0 (0.750) in their last 22 regular season games against Chicago, including an 8-2-0-0 (0.800) mark in their last 10 at Allstate Arena.

Chicago Connections

Wolves first-year head coach Rocky Thompson served on **Todd Nelson's** staff as an assistant with the AHL's Oklahoma City Barons from 2010-14...In those four seasons, the Barons posted a 161-105-10-32 (0.591) record and advanced to the postseason every year, including a trip to the 2013 Western Conference Finals...Thompson was elevated to an assistant with the parent Edmonton Oilers for the 2014-15 campaign, a season that saw Nelson take over the NHL club on an interim basis in Dec. 2014...Former Griffin Teemu Pulkkinen leads the Wolves with 24 points (9-15—24) in 28 games...A 2013 Calder Cup champion with Grand Rapids, Pulkkinen skated in 119 games with the Griffins from 2012-15 and scored 121 points (65-56—121), while being named a First Team AHL All-Star selection in 2014-15...He appeared in 40 postseason contests and ranks among the franchise's all-time playoff leaders with 34 points (T3rd), 22 goals (2nd) and nine power play goals (1st)...Nelson served as an assistant coach for the Wolves for two seasons (2006-08) and won the 2008 Calder Cup in his final season with Chicago...Assistant coach **Ben Simon** appeared in 196 games with the Wolves from 2001-03 and 2004-05 and was a part of Chicago's first Calder Cup title in 2002...Third-year defenseman **Robbie Russo** is from Chicagoland's Westmont...Russo and T.J. Tynan were teammates at Notre Dame from 2011-14...Second-year pro Mackenzie MacEachern, a native of Troy, Mich., played three seasons at Michigan State (2013-16) and tallied 68 points (33-35—68) in 108 games...Scooter Vaughan played at Michigan from 2007-11 and recorded 39 points (16-23—39) in 137 games.

Entering Thursday

The defending Calder Cup champion Griffins earned three out of a possible six points last week and show a 10-14-1-3 (0.429) record. Grand Rapids is coming off a 2-1 overtime loss to Milwaukee last Saturday and will hit the road for three games in three nights this week before breaking for the holiday.

Matinee Games

Today's game at Chicago marks the Griffins' third and final weekday matinee contest of the season. Both of Grand Rapids' two previous weekday early start games of the year came against San Antonio, as the Griffins beat the Rampage 7-4 in the team's 17th annual matinee game at Van Andel Arena on Nov. 8 and defeated their Texan counterparts in the rematch at the AT&T Center by a 6-3 decision on Nov. 14. Grand Rapids is 16-8-2-1 (0.648) all time in matinee games, including a 5-3-2-0 mark on the road (see chart).

Missing Pieces

The Griffins have played without four of their top six scorers recently. **Matt Puempel**, the team's leading scorer (9-12—21), and **Matt Lorto** (7-10—17) have been out with injury for the last four games while **Turner Elson** (8-6—14) has been sidelined for the last six contests due to illness and **Eric Tangradi** (7-11—18) missed last Saturday's game due to injury. As announced by the AHL on Monday, **Matthew Ford** (10-8—18) – the team's leading goal scorer – has been suspended for today's game at Chicago as a consequence of a slew-footing incident in the game against Milwaukee last Saturday.

Holiday Hustle

The Griffins play a total of four three-in-threes this season and three of those come in the month of December. Grand Rapids' holiday break is bookended by two three-games-in-three-nights stretches (Dec. 21-23 and Dec. 29-31).

Repeat Opponents

Starting Dec. 2 at Chicago and concluding Feb. 7 vs. Manitoba, the Griffins play 28 straight games against Central Division foes. Under third-year head coach **Todd Nelson**, the Griffins are 83-46-3-6 (0.634) against the Central and hold a +84 scoring margin in those 138 games.

Milestones

Several Griffins are approaching career benchmarks, including **Corey Elkins** (98 pro goals), **Turner Elson** (197 AHL games and 96 pro points), **Matthew Ford** (399 pro points), **Evgeny Svechnikov** (97 AHL games) and **Dominic Turgeon** (99 AHL games).

Back-to-Back-to-Backs

The Griffins will play back-to-back games a total of 24 times this season. Grand Rapids plays its second of four three-in-threes this week. Compare the statistics for when Grand Rapids has played on consecutive nights:

TODD NELSON
HEAD COACH

Todd Nelson, 48, became the 10th head coach in Griffins history on June 19, 2015, after splitting the 2014-15 season in head-coaching roles with the AHL's Oklahoma City Barons and NHL's Edmonton Oilers.

Nelson guided the Griffins to their second championship in 2016-17, joining Bob Woods and Mike Stothers as the only people to win the Calder Cup as a player (1994 Portland), assistant coach (2008 Chicago) and head coach. After posting a 100 point regular season (47-23-1-5), Grand Rapids roared through the playoffs with a 15-4 record, including a perfect 10-0 mark at Van Andel Arena that made the Griffins just the fourth team in league history to forge a 10-game home winning streak in a single postseason. They authored a three-game, first-round sweep of Milwaukee before subduing first-place powers Chicago (4-1), San Jose (4-1) and Syracuse (4-2), becoming the first team since Hershey in 2006 to defeat three division champions in the playoffs.

During Nelson's first season as Grand Rapids' bench boss in 2015-16, the Griffins posted a 44-30-1-1 mark and shattered team records with winning streaks of 15 and 13 games – becoming just the second AHL team in the last 25 years with two double-digit runs in a single season – while also claiming a record 14 straight victories on home ice. After upsetting Central Division champion Milwaukee in a three-game sweep during the first round of the playoffs, Grand Rapids fell to eventual Calder Cup champion Lake Erie 4-2 in the division finals, inflicting the only losses the Monsters would suffer during their 15-2 run to the title.

Nelson, a native of Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, guided Oklahoma City to a 15-6-2-2 record and first place in the West Division in 2014-15, including a 10-game point streak from Nov. 15-Dec. 6, before taking over for Dallas Eakins as the interim head coach of the Oilers on Dec. 15. In his first stint as an NHL head coach, Nelson led Edmonton to a 17-22-7 record in 46 games.

One of the most accomplished defensemen in Grand Rapids history, Nelson was the first player ever signed to a Griffins contract on July 24, 1996, prior to the team's inaugural season. Through parts of four seasons, Nelson amassed 67 points (11-56-67) and 123 penalty minutes in 236 career games with Grand Rapids. Most notably, Nelson was a member of the Griffins' 1999-00 squad that reached the IHL Turner Cup Finals. He was an honorable mention IHL All-Star that season after leading the league with a plus-36 rating, and he ranks eighth overall in franchise history with a plus-53 rating.

Nelson's 236 games played as a Griffin rank still eighth among defensemen. Following in the footsteps of Danton Cole (2002-05), whom he served under as an assistant coach, Nelson is the second former Griffins player to be employed as Grand Rapids' head coach.

A fourth-round selection by the Pittsburgh Penguins in the 1989 NHL Entry Draft, Nelson appeared in three regular season and four playoff games with the Penguins and Washington Capitals between 1991-94. In addition to his three Calder Cups, Nelson won a 2002 UHL Colonial Cup with the Muskegon Fury as a player/assistant coach to go with 2004 and 2005 titles as Muskegon's head coach. He also made consecutive IHL All-Star Game appearances in 1992 (Muskegon Lumberjacks) and 1993 (Cleveland Lumberjacks).

He and his wife, Josette, have a son, Colton, and a daughter, Kyleigh.

BEN SIMON
ASSISTANT COACH

A native of Shaker Heights, Ohio, Ben Simon returns for his third season behind the Griffins' bench after having helped Grand Rapids win the 2017 Calder Cup. It marked the second time that Simon earned the right to hoist the AHL's championship trophy, as he first won it as a forward with the Chicago Wolves in 2002.

Simon, 39, spent three seasons as an assistant coach in the AHL before coming to West Michigan, most recently helping the Toronto Marlies to a 40-27-9-0 mark and a playoff berth during the 2014-15 season.

Simon's coaching career began in 2010-11 as the head coach of the EIHL's Sheffield Steelers. He earned a 43-10-0-1 record (0.806) and led the team to a regular season championship, then spent the following two seasons as an assistant coach with the AHL's Rockford IceHogs. Simon then posted a 41-23-4-4 record as the head coach of the ECHL's Cincinnati Cyclones in 2013-14, leading his team to the Kelly Cup Finals.

Including Todd Nelson, Bruce Ramsay and Mike Knuble, all four of Grand Rapids' coaches are former Griffins, as Simon notched nine points (4-5—9) in 21 games with the team in 2006-07. Originally drafted by the Chicago Blackhawks in the fifth round (110th overall) of the 1997 NHL Entry Draft, he played four seasons for the University of Notre Dame, serving as the Irish's captain as a senior in 1999-2000. Simon went on to log 81 NHL games with Atlanta and Columbus and nearly 500 AHL contests during his 11-year playing career. He also won an IHL Turner Cup with Orlando in 2001.

Simon and his wife, Beth, have two daughters, Margaret and Katherine.

BRUCE RAMSAY
ASSISTANT COACH

One of the most popular players during the Griffins' tenure in the International Hockey League, **Bruce Ramsay** begins his third season as an assistant coach under former teammate Todd Nelson. He helped guide Grand Rapids to the Calder Cup title last season, on the heels of a 2015-16 campaign in which the Griffins advanced to the second round of the playoffs.

Prior to rejoining the Griffins, the 48-year-old Ramsay spent six seasons as the head coach of the Tulsa Oilers in the ECHL and Central Hockey League, compiling a 185-180-35 record in 400 regular season games from 2009-15. Ramsay's Oilers earned a 37-29-3-3 record in their first ECHL campaign in 2014-15 and qualified for the 2015 Kelly Cup Playoffs, where they fell to the eventual champion Allen Americans in five games during the first round.

A native of Dryden, Ontario, Ramsay previously served as an assistant for Nelson from 2004-06, when the duo led the UHL's Muskegon Fury to the Colonial Cup during their first season together and a 51-18-7 regular season record in their subsequent campaign. After Nelson departed for an assistant coaching position with the Chicago Wolves, Ramsay succeeded his colleague as the head coach of the Fury and produced an 84-56-12 regular season record in two seasons (2006-08) behind the bench. In all, Ramsay's head coaching career spans 12 seasons between stints with the ACHL's St. Pete/Winstom-Salem Parrots (2002-03), the UHL's Port Huron Beacons (2002-04), the Fury, the IHL's Muskegon Lumberjacks (2008-09) and the Oilers.

Ramsay and Nelson were both members of the Griffins during the team's inaugural season in 1996-97, and Ramsay collected nine goals and 14 assists in 175 games over three seasons (1996-99) with the team. His 781 penalty minutes as a Griffin rank second in franchise history, and he's one of just three Grand Rapids players to ever twice eclipse 300 PIM, producing 306 PIM in 1996-97 and leading the team with 310 PIM in 1997-98. In 12 seasons as a professional player (1991-02, 2004-05), Ramsay amassed 245 points (74-171—245) and 3,432 PIM in 677 games.

Ramsay graduated from Ontario's Lakehead University in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in mathematics. He and his wife, Jennifer, have a daughter, Natalie, and a son, Reid.

MIKE KNUBLE

ASSISTANT COACH

A 1997-98 Stanley Cup champion with the Detroit Red Wings and veteran of 1,068 NHL games, **Mike Knuble** earned his first Calder Cup last season as a member of the Griffins' coaching staff. He returns for his fifth season as an assistant coach, having helped guide the team to at least the second round of the playoffs in each of his first four seasons.

Knuble, a native of Kentwood, Mich., logged 16 NHL seasons after being drafted by Detroit in the fourth round (76th overall) of the 1991 NHL Entry Draft. The 45-year-old made his NHL debut with the Red Wings in 1996-97 and capped off three seasons in the organization by helping the team win its second straight Cup in 1998, before playing for the New York Rangers (1998-00), Boston Bruins (1999-04), Philadelphia Flyers (2005-09; 2012-13) and Washington Capitals (2009-12).

Born in Toronto, Knuble led the East Kentwood High School Falcons to a Michigan state championship in 1990 and eventually played four seasons at the University of Michigan (1991-95). He even logged one game with the Griffins on Jan. 23, 2013, becoming just the second Greater Grand Rapids native to play for the team.

A member of the 2014 class of the Grand Rapids Sports Hall of Fame, Knuble resides in East Grand Rapids with his wife, Megan, and their three children, Cam, Anna and Cole.

BRIAN MAHONEY-WILSON

GOALTENDING DEVELOPMENT COACH

After winning a Calder Cup in his first season as a coach in the AHL, **Brian Mahoney-Wilson** begins his second season as the Detroit Red Wings' goaltending development coach, working with the Griffins, the ECHL's Toledo Walleye and other Detroit prospects.

Mahoney-Wilson, 31, mentored a Grand Rapids goaltending unit that backstopped a 100-point season before authoring a 15-4 record during the playoffs. Before joining the pro ranks, he spent the 2015-16 season as an assistant coach at Notre Dame and helped the Fighting Irish reach the NCAA Tournament with a 19-11-7 record. Working with the special teams and goaltenders, he saw Irish netminders post a 2.28 goals against average and a 0.925 save percentage, both fourth-best in Hockey East.

In 2014-15, Mahoney-Wilson served as an assistant/goaltending coach with the United States Military Academy (AHA). The West Roxbury, Mass., native also has coaching experience with the South Shore Kings (USPHL) in 2013-14 as well as a number of goaltending programs in Massachusetts, including Stop It Goaltending, Massachusetts Crease and Lovell's Hockey Schools.

San Jose's ninth choice (288th overall) in the 2004 NHL Entry Draft, Mahoney-Wilson appeared in 66 combined games during his junior career from 2004-07 with Walpole (EJHL), Lincoln (USHL), Newmarket (OPJHL) and Georgetown (OPJHL). Mahoney-Wilson played four seasons (2007-11) at Lake Superior State (CCHA) and compiled a 27-41-15 record, a 2.95 goals against average and a 0.906 save percentage. Following his collegiate career, Mahoney-Wilson played one season as a professional in the Central Hockey League. In 28 games between Allen, Missouri and Bloomington, he totaled a 10-11-1 record, a 3.35 GAA and a 0.895 save percentage.

Mahoney-Wilson has family ties to the Red Wings organization. His grandfather, Larry Wilson, won the 1950 Stanley Cup with Detroit while appearing in 16 career games across two stints with the team (1949-50, 1952-53) and also coached the Red Wings for 36 games during the 1976-77 season. His great uncle, Johnny Wilson, coached the Red Wings for two seasons (1971-73) and played in 379 games with the team (1949-55, 57-59), winning four Stanley Cups (1950, 1952, 1954, 1955).

Brian and his wife, Keri, celebrated their wedding last summer, shortly after the Griffins' championship campaign concluded.

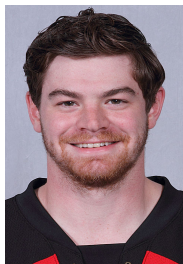
BILL LEROY
